

ACF Marks International Day for Education



The United Nations General Assembly proclaimed 24 January every year as International Day of Education, in celebration of the role of education for peace and development. To commemorate the International Day for Education 2024, ACF team engaged students of Government Girls Secondary School Ladi Atiku, on 26th of January, 2024. During the activity the students were sensitized on the role of education in sustainable peace, while also emphasizing the important role an educated girl child plays in bringing about lasting peace. The activity empowered girls with critical thinking skills to

discern facts from fiction, challenge biases and navigate stereotype with empathy and respect thereby cultivating understanding and tolerance by fostering appreciation for diverse cultures, perspectives and experiences.

ACF Empowers Women and Girls in Namtari ACF Marks **Community to Combat Misinformation**

n February 23, 2024, Alimat Care Foundation (ACF) with funding support On June 7, 2024, Aliment Care from Brain Builders Youth Development Initiative, held a community sensitization workshop to empower women and girls in Namtari community of Yola South LGA to identify and combat misinformation. The event, which took place at a local community center, attracted over 110 participants.

ACF team provided a comprehensive overview of the dangers of misinformation, highlighting how it can lead to negative consequences for individuals and communities. They taught participants how to identify misinformation, critically evaluate information, and use factchecking tools. Through interactive discussions and personal anecdotes, participants shared their experiences with misinformation and learned practical strategies to protect themselves from its harmful effects.

The sensitization workshop successfully increased awareness among the beneficiaries about the different types of misinformation and provided them with the tools to identify and verify information. The participants expressed gratitude for the opportunity to learn these valuable skills and pledged to use them to promote critical thinking and informed decisionmaking within their community.



World Environmental Day

Foundation (ACF) commemorated World Environment Day with a significant event at Government Day Secondary School Bekaji. The event focused on educating students about land restoration and building climate change resilience, highlighting the importance of community



collaboration in addressing environmental challenges and emphasizing ACF's mission to improve the lives and future prospects of girls.

The event featured presentations on land restoration, climate change, and the role of trees in the school environment. Mr. Atiku Jatau led a practical tree-planting exercise, demonstrating sustainable environmental practices.

n 31st January, 2024 our Executive Director, Ibrahim Bello featured as a radio guest at Fombina FM, Yola to sensitize the public on the role of bystander intervention in the fight against GBV.

During the Live show, he emphasized that by-stander intervention plays a crucial role in the fight to end gender-based violence (GBV) for several reasons and explained that



bystander intervention can take many forms, from directly confronting the abuser to discreetly reporting the incident or offering support to the victim. The program provided an opportunity for thousands of listeners to understand the role of by-stander in the fight against SGBV.

On 13th February, 2024 ACF team participated in a workshop organized by IFPRI under the GCAN project at AUN Hotel in Yola. The workshop aimed at identifying and mapping key stakeholders responsible for climate change policy development and implementation in the state. The is the first step towards ensuring that gender and nutrition are mainstreamed into all climate change policies in the state and nation at large.



Adamawa CS-SUNN Champions Nutrition Advocacy: Increased Budget, Extended Maternity Leave, and Collaboration Highlighted

On 29th June 2024, the Adamawa State Chapter of the Civil Society Scaling Up Nutrition in Nigeria (CS-SUNN), concluded a series of successful advocacy meetings with key government officials. These meetings aimed to address critical nutrition challenges in the state.

The CS-SUNN delegation, comprised of representatives from eleven NGOs led by the state coordinator Mr. Ibrahim Bello (Executive Director ACF), met with the Commissioner of Health and Human Services, the Permanent Secretary of the Ministry of Budget and Planning, and the Head of Civil Service. Their advocacy focused on three key areas:

- **Increased Budgetary Allocation:** CS-SUNN called for a significant increase in the state budget allocated to nutrition programs. They emphasized the long-term benefits of investing in nutrition for child development, public health, and overall economic prosperity.
- Extended Paid Maternity Leave: The delegation advocated for extending paid maternity leave for female civil servants from 3 months to 6 months. This change according to the advocates would promote maternal and infant health by allowing more time for recovery and fostering optimal breastfeeding practices.
- Enhanced Collaboration: CS-SUNN underscored the importance of stronger collaboration between government agencies, civil society organizations, and other stakeholders to develop a more holistic and effective approach to tackling malnutrition in Adamawa State.



ACF Conducts Community Entry Visit in Yolde Pate

On June 8, 2024, the Alimat Care Foundation (ACF) conducted a community entry visit to Yolde Pate. The team, led by the Executive Director Mr. Ibrahim Bello, met with community leader to discuss ACF's new climate resilience and adaptation project.

During the meeting, the ACF team emphasized the importance of involving women in climate change initiatives. They requested the community leaders to identify and map out 20 women who would benefit directly from the project.

The community head expressed full support for the project and offered his home as a venue for future activities.



Climat Change Advocacy and Influencing Actions



on 13th February 2024, ACF joined other Climate Justice Activists in Adamawa State to present a draft policy on climate change to the House Committee on Environment in the Adamawa State House of Assembly for their consideration. This is a result of several months of lobbying both at the state and national level for a legal framework that addresses climate change and its devastating impacts.

UPCOMING EVENTS

* ACF is launching a new self-funded project titled "Strengthening Community resilience and adaptation to climate change in Adamawa State" The project seek to empower Women as active agents of change and enhance their capacity to lead community-based climate change adaptation and Mitigation in their communities.

Project objective:

- 1. Empower 30 women of Yolde-Parte Community to become leaders in building resilence against climate change by October 2024
- 2. Enhance food security by empowering 30 women of yolde-parte community with the skill and knowledge to aid agricultural practice.
- 3. Promote Gender Equality by increasing access to resources and decision making power for 30 women of Yolde-Parte Community by 2024

CF is launching a new teacher development training project titled "Scaling Up Gender-Responsive Pedagogy in Adamawa State". The new project seeks to scale up gender-responsive pedagogy (GRP) in secondary schools across Adamawa State. Building upon a successful training of trainers (ToT) program, ACF aims to equip school heads with the knowledge, skills, and tools to implement GRP effectively in their classrooms. By enhancing gender-sensitivity and inclusivity in education, the project seeks to improve learning outcomes for all students, particularly girls.
